
## TRAFFIC SIGNAL PARAGRAPH WRITING

- GO: Write your topic sentence. Topic sentence = what the paragraph is going to be about.
- SLOW DOWN: Give a detail, reason, fact, or example that connects to what the paragraph is about. This can be more than 1 sentence.
- STOP: Explain your yellow sentence and/or provide an example from the text to suppor the detail, reason, or fact. This can be more than 1 sentence.
  - \*\*\*REPEAT -- You can repeat the yellow & red sentences as many times as needed. It is important, however, to always have them both!
  - GO BACK: Remind your reader what the paragraph was about; a summary of the paragraph.
